Introduction

Many countries embarking on nuclear power and research programmes have established their nuclear regulatory bodies, yet their activities related to nuclear security are currently being undertaken without the necessary nuclear security competence. Such countries have expressed their needs for capacity building of their regulatory staff to perform regulatory functions and enhancement of their regulatory frameworks for nuclear security. This training course aims to provide the necessary guidance and training to staff of the regulatory bodies for the effective implementation of the nuclear security regulatory functions using a systematic approach to training. The course will consist of lectures and group exercises. During the course, the participants will apply the course concepts and principles through practical exercises.

Objectives

To provide participants with introductory knowledge and understanding related to the regulatory functions for security of nuclear material, nuclear facilities and associated activities. The course will also address the needs and priorities of regulatory staff to perform regulatory functions.

Target Audience

Staff from the regulatory bodies, other competent authorities or organizations responsible for performing or supporting regulatory functions related to the security for nuclear material, nuclear facilities and associated activities.

Participation and Registration

All persons wishing to participate in the event have to be designated by an IAEA Member State or should be members of organizations that have been invited to attend.

In order to be designated by an IAEA Member State, participants are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** to their competent national authority (e.g. Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) for onward transmission to the IAEA by **7 September 2020**. Participants who are members of an organization invited to attend are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** through their organization to the IAEA by above deadline.

Selected participants will be informed in due course on the procedures to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.

Please note that the IAEA is in a transition phase to manage the entire registration process for all regular programme events electronically through the new InTouch+ (<https://intouchplus.iaea.org>) facility, which is the improved and expanded successor to the InTouch platform that has been used in recent years for the IAEA's technical cooperation events. Through InTouch+, prospective participants will be able to apply for events and submit all required documents online. National authorities will be able to use InTouch+ to review and approve these applications. Expenditures and Grants
